## Job description:

The Story Tapestries' Fellowship provides an opportunity for intense hands-on preparation for two Teaching Artists and Arts Administrators to learn both the "in the field" and administrative aspects of earning a living wage as an effective Teaching Artist and Arts Administrator in Montgomery County. The fellowship will provide hands-on experience in both the field work of coordinating programs, raising money for nonprofits, and leading programs as a Teaching Artist, as well as dive deeply into the administrative aspects of the work. The Fellowship aims to build a bridge for two young professionals to access the skills, experience and networks that can support their ability to earn a living wage within the County.

- Learn how to use the organization's software to support a range of administrative functions (ex: Google Workspace, Salesforce, Quickbooks, MailChimp, Canva), and more.
- Support booking and coordinating performances and programs that happen during the school day directly for Story Tapestries and with current partners:
  - o Communicate with existing and potential collaborators
  - o Set-up program budgets and write contracts
  - o Identify and contract with artists
  - o Send invoices
  - o Schedule program dates
  - o Add programs to the appropriate calendars
  - Learn the skills of being a master teaching artist
    - Shadow expert teaching artists to learn specific skills

  - o Working with teaching artists and staff to update language and design of support materials (print and digital) to be equitable and inclusive
